


We often have accent and pronunciation classes. Practicing with the right pronunciation and accent is tremendously important.

Not only for understandable speech, but also for more beautiful speech, students spend extra time on exercises.



REVERSE READING FOR INTERMEDIATE STUDENTS



For reading comprehension, we usually start "reading": get a book, read sentences in your mind, check unknown vocabulary and grammar, understand the story, and listen to the sound, then practice, practice, practice until it comes automatically from your mouth. However, this unique project focuses on more listening and writing. Surprisingly, reading comes at the very end.

Students listen to the story then dictate the sentences on a shared document. It is often checked by the instructor and corrected until it matches the original story. Understanding the former parts of the story, students repeat this process until the whole story is done.

This practice improves listening skills greatly, as well as writing and reading.

Siaw En and her family visited our homestay family in Japan


While travelling in Japan, Siaw En's Family visited our host family, Akina and Taka. Staying overnight in their residence, they had many fun activities together.
